The Wiley College Men's Basketball team has rose to national prominence making six NAIA Tournament Appearances. It advanced to the second round in 2019 and 1970.

The Wildcats are entering their first season in the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference after competing in the Red River Athletic Conference from 1998-2022. Wiley College is coming off a 10-win season after not competing in 2020-21. Seven players return from that squad, including starters Demarius Houston, Jalen Brown and David Williams.

Houston led the team with 47 three-pointers, an average of 2.4 per game. He averaged 9.4 points per game. Jalen Brown averaged 8.6 points and 4.2 rebounds in nine games. David Williams tallied 5.5 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. He scored in double figures in three of his last five games. Deonte Spencer put up six points and 3.6 rebounds per game. He had three double-digit scoring games.

Joseph Flegler enters his first season with the Wildcats. Last season he led Ecclesia College to a 14-6 record.
